SYMPOSIUM PROGRAMME

IMPORTANT NOTES:

The programme includes technical information on the scientific and social aspects of the Symposium.

The scientific programme is split into two sections. During the morning sessions, the delegates are allocated an hour of debate on the topic of their choice (see book of abstracts and presentation guidelines). During the evening sessions, working groups will be formed to debate issues of global interest in a Greek symposium manner. The values and rules of the symposium methodology will be discussed and agreed upon during the opening ceremony. The sessions will be chaired by the Symposium organising committee and notes will be taken by the Secretariat. Photographs and occasional filming will take place. Consent forms will be provided upon registration. Delegates are requested to indicate any issues that they might have as soon as possible.
